

SIR THOMAS RICH'S SCHOOL 16-19 BURSARY APPLICATION FORM 2023 – 2024

The 16–19 Bursary Fund Scheme was set up by the Government in 2011 to 'provide financial assistance to those young people who face a financial barrier to continuing education or training post-16.' You are eligible to apply for bursary if you meet either of the criteria listed below:

- If you are living in care, a care leaver, receiving Income Support/Universal Credit or are disabled in receipt of both Employment Support Allowance/Universal Credit and Disability Living Allowance, in your own right, you will be given the highest priority and may be eligible to receive a Bursary of up to £1,200 a year.
- If you are aged between 16 and 19 on 31st August in the academic year in which you start your programme of study, and you satisfy Education Funding Agency (EFA) residency criteria, and your household income is below £26,000, you may be eligible for a smaller bursary.

Applicants should be aware that the School is only allocated a finite amount of money for bursaries and this will be distributed amongst applicants in relation to their priority levels of eligibility. Once this money has been allocated there will be no more money to distribute. You should note that applying does not guarantee STRS can meet your claim.

Please be aware that you need to **complete all necessary sections of this form and provide evidence** of household income in order to be considered. Please submit **photocopies** of any declared benefits or income. All information will be treated with the strictest confidence.

Procedure & Notes

- 1. Application form to be completed by the student and submitted, with supporting evidence, to Mrs J Miller in the School Finance Office by **22 September 2023**.
- 2. Your application will be assessed, and you will then be informed if your application has been successful.
- **3.** If your application has been unsuccessful, reasons will be provided. You can appeal against this decision by writing to the school within seven days.
- **4.** Payments are made directly to students by BACS periodically throughout the academic year. These payments do not affect other means tested benefits families might be in receipt of. (A BACS form will be given to you if your application is successful).
- **5.** Payments will be backdated to the start of the academic year in September.
- **6.** Failure to meet the terms of the 16-19 Bursary Agreement may lead to the cessation of payments. You will be notified of this in writing. (The Agreement will be given to you if your application is successful).
- **7.** If a student who has received financial assistance leaves before the completion of their course, they may be required to repay all or part of their grant.
