- follow all reasonable instructions given by teachers, non-teaching staff, prefects promptly and without arguing;
- obey school rules

# **The Parents' Agreement**

#### To:

- insist on excellent attendance and punctuality, **informing the School about any absences immediately via the Parent Gateway or by telephone,** and also by letter on the student's return to school;
- not take family trips or holidays during term time;
- encourage and support the student's work;
- check the School's homework communication service (Satchel One) at least every week;
- make every effort to attend Parents' Consultation Evenings and any special appointments;
- provide the student with correct school uniform;
- provide the student with the necessary equipment for school;
- pay for the replacement of damaged or lost equipment or books;
- support the policies of the School (available on the School website and/or from reception);
- support the student's participation in extra-curricular activities, as much as possible.
- notify the School of any concerns or problems which might affect their child's work or behaviour.
